Learning Theme; Journeys



Last week lots of postcards arrived in school from some of the different places Paddington Bear had visited. He went to the Phillipines, Korea and Egypt. We enjoyed talking about the different things he might have done on each holiday. What each place is like and how he travelled between each one

This week we will be wondering where Paddington is going to next, and how he is going to get there. Our focus will be on the airport and the Cubs will draw on their own experiences to explore how airports work and the different stages in the journey from hotel or home, to the airport, to check in and into departures.





Our Big Question will be;

'What will we need in our airport?'

Development Outcomes

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- Children use ... future forms accurately when talking about events that are to happen in the future.

Vocabulary: journey, already, before, went, have been, last week/month/year, clue, where,

Literacy;

We will be encouraging the children to talk about Paddingtons on going journey using future forms, 'will'. Using the construction kits and small world we will support the children to build a story about Paddingtons journey with a beginning, middle and end as he arrives at his next destination.

Vocabulary: next, then, after that, will, beginning, middle, end

Development Outcomes

- Children use ... future forms accurately when talking about events that have happened or are to happen in the future.
- They develop their own narratives and explanations by connecting ideas or events.

Phonics

Sharks Will be working on the digraphs (two letters making one sound) ai and ee to recognise them and use them when sounding for reading and writing words for example, main, see. We will practise tricky words; you, all. These will be in your phonics bags with the new digraphs ai and ee by the end of the week to practice.

Octopus We will be using all the phase 2 letters and sounds taught and adding new sounds x, y, z, zz, qu, sh We will practise the tricky words he we me be she

Jellyfish We will be will be using all the single letter sounds and practising blending to read simple words an segmenting to write CVC words e.g. hat, run, lip.... we will also practise the tricky words I, go, no, to, into, the

Mathematics

The children will be making addition stories this week to practice their addition in a practical way. We will offer the children a variety of settings for their stories and some props to help them tell their story. E.g. At the airport there were 3 aeroplanes waiting on the runway and 2 more arrived, how many planes are there all together? Children can draw their addition stories and/or use small world to act them out.

Vocabulary: how many, altogether, equal, add, amount

Development outcomes

Using quantities and objects, children add ... two single-digit numbers
