ENGLISH

Next week in English, the children will read the story 'The mixed up Chameleon' by Eric Carle. They will explore how a chameleon adapts to its environment. The focus will be to construct simple sentences that include; conjunctions, punctuation marks and adjectives.

MATHEMATICS

Our Maths focus this week is Number and Place value. The children will practice counting forwards and backwards up to one hundred. Numbers will be placed and ordered in and out of sequence. The children will count on or back from a given number. They will be encouraged to use Mathematical vocabulary to explain their work. E.g. equal to, more than, less than (fewer), most and least.



TOPIC

This week the 'Personal Goal' we will be focusing on will be 'Adaptability.'

We will look at how different animals are suited and adapted to their environments. The children will become human chameleons as they explore how they have adapted to living in China.

'As geographers' the children will look at different climates and try to identify specific countries on a map. They will be encouraged to use their enquiry skills to make comparisons between their current place of residence and their home countries. The children will create their own 3D habitats using recycled materials. If you have any materials at home that would be suitable, please send them to school.
