SCIENCE

We run a bespoke course, aimed at linking Year 7 through to Year 13 so there is no official course we follow. There are supplemental resources on BBC bitesize (https://www.bbc.co.uk/bitesize/subjects/zng4d2p) which may also be useful as well as excellent YouTube channels such as Physics Girl (https://www.youtube.com/user/physicswoman), Crash Course Kids (https://www.youtube.com/user/crashcoursekids) and TED Ed (https://www.youtube.com/user/TEDEducation).

Over the summer break I strongly recommend students do some science at home. There are 155 experiments that can be performed with simple household equipment here (<u>https://spark.iop.org/collections/marvin-and-milo</u>). We would love to see photographs or videos of you doing them. The PHET website (<u>https://phet.colorado.edu</u>) also has a number of excellent simulations students can use to investigate scientific phenomena. If you are

feeling brave you could even attempt the KS3 Science SAT papers that were once completed as a check on learning at the end of Year 9. You can find links to these papers and their mark schemes here: <u>http://www.satspapers.org/scienceKS2SATS.htm</u>.
