

Why do we offer the IB Diploma?


- a holistic approach

The IB Diploma at TBS – the last 5 years


IBDP 5-year average = 35 points

The IBDP – 45 points maximum

The IBDP Curriculum is composed of six subject groups:

- A student must choose 3 subjects at Higher Level and 3 subjects at Standard Level
- Each subject is scored 1-7 points
- A student must take a subject out of each Group 1 -5 and either Music,
 Visual Arts in Group 6 or another subject that we offer

In addition each student studies what is known as the Core

- Theory of Knowledge & Extended Essay add up to 3 additional IB points
- Creativity, Activity & Service including a CAS project



The IBDP – 24 points to gain the full IBDP Diploma

- Score at least 12 points in your HL subjects
- Score a minimum of 24 points across all 6 subjects including
 Theory of Knowledge and the Extended Essay
- Attain at least a D grade in both Theory of Knowledge and the Extended Essay
- Complete all aspect of the CAS programme including a CAS project
- 3,6,12,24,45 key numbers

The IB - how difficult is it?



"While the IB Diploma is academically rigorous, it is not an elitist course designed only for high achievers. It is academically challenging but it also rewards hard work. All TBS students can obtain the IB Diploma, provided they manage their time well, meet deadlines effectively and engage fully with the programme"

Universities entry requirements

- The top universities expect students to score 36 40 points
- Oxbridge universities expect 42+ points and 8A* at IGCSE
- Universities in the UK offer courses to students with 24 points
- More and more US universities accept the IB diploma as a direct entry qualification
- The IB is looked upon favourably by all universities because of its breadth of knowledge and focus on individual study
- IB Courses allows students to access UK foundation courses

- International Business No specific HL subjects required (24+)
