The Middle Years Programme

Students aged 11 to 15 embarking on the MYP are encouraged to develop their attitudes, values and skills as well as broaden their thinking, explore world issues and make practical connections between their studies and the real world. At a time when students are establishing their identity and building self-esteem, the MYP is uniquely designed to help students achieve success in school and in life.

Being inquiry based and concept driven, the MYP ensures breadth and depth of understanding through study in a wide range of subject groups. It also addresses the intellectual, social, emotional and physical well-being of students and prepares them to take principled action by participating in service within the community.

MYP students also engage with big ideas, rather than simply memorising facts in order to prepare for exams. As a result, they develop learning skills that they can rely on throughout the course of their independent, purpose-driven lives.

As students develop as global learners, their ability to transfer understanding to unfamiliar situations, and their capacity to connect academic study with the world beyond the classroom increases.

A passport to success

The Diploma Programme

From ages 16 through to 18 your child will follow the Diploma Programme and ICS is recognised globally for its expertise and success in delivering this prestigious qualification. It's a demanding and rigorous programme that requires students to fully apply themselves in developing their own learning and understanding but the rewards offered make it worthwhile as it fully prepares them for their next step towards their chosen university and gives them a solid grounding with skills and attributes they will benefit from for the rest of their lives.

The programme consists of three main components:

Theory of Knowledge

A course on critical thinking and understanding how we learn and build knowledge.

The Extended Essay

An in-depth independent research project relating to one of the subjects they are studying.

Creativity, Action and Service (CAS)

This range of activities, alongside academic studies, is designed to develop creative skills, health and wellbeing, and a commitment to the communities in which they live.

For the core academic curriculum, students must choose one subject from each of the following five groups:

- . Studies in language and literature
- . Language acquisition
- . Individuals and society
- . Sciences
- . Mathematics

They will also take a sixth subject which can either be a second subject from one of the above, or may be an arts subject. The Diploma Programme enables students to reflect on the nature of knowledge, complete independent research, and undertake a project that often involves community service. It is structured to allow students to flourish physically, intellectually, emotionally and ethically.

University preparation

The IB Diploma teaches the skills and ways of learning that will enable students to enter Further Education levels with confidence and capability. The programme encourages students to master fundamental skills such as university style report and essay writing and to develop good study habits alongside working on ways to better manage their time, important skills for university life where they are in charge of their own learning schedules.

Well-rounded education and personal development

No other curriculum comes close to the breadth nor depth of study that the IB offers and students at ICS are exposed to a much wider range of subjects than available in other curriculums. We believe it is this choice that helps develop well-rounded students, showing their adaptability, strength of character, and ability to push themselves.

ICS students have the opportunity to participate in a wide and varied range of extra-curricular activities. As well as encouraging students to develop initiative and leadership skills. extra-curricular activities allow students to appreciate the value of teamwork, co-operation and participation, enabling them to get the most out of school life and widen their social circle. 
