## Who are we fundraising for?

#### Why PAH?

#### Why Somalia?

Somalia is only one of the many places PAH is targeting at the time of the pandemic.

The unstable political situation in Solamia, harsh climate conditions, and therefore shortage of food and clean water have long made them a priority.

Now, at a time when hygiene and isolation are more vital than ever, we must work to provide those basic resources, hygiene education and medical care.
