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Overview

Nord Anglia International School Rotterdam (NAISR) offers an excellent co-curricular programme that includes opportunities for students to join a number of sports teams, participate in a band, as well as participate in a number of fun clubs and activities that allow students to learn new skills or develop existing ones.

All after-school activities operate throughout the year (except for team sports, which are seasonal), running between **September 13, 2021** and **May 27, 2022**.

Session time slots are as follows: Session 1 - 15:15 to 16:00 Session 2 - 16:15 to 17:00

Parents may choose register their child for Term 1, Term 2, or for the full year.

Clubs and Skill Development Sessions

Clubs are opportunities for students to engage in fun activities that help to promote learning and social engagement. Clubs are designed to help students explore their passions and meet other students. Each club requires a minimum of three students to operate.

Skill Development Sessions (SDS) are formal after school tutorials where students gain additional, regular support in a specific academic area. Private lessons provide one-to-one instruction, while group sessions provide support for three to five students.

Athletics

NAISR offers opportunities for students to participate in an inter-school athletics programme. NAISR teams compete against teams from other international schools in the Netherlands, Germany, Denmark, Sweden, Norway, Belgium, and Luxembourg. In addition, we also offer various 'Junior Sharks' sports clubs, which enable students to practice their chosen sport on a weekly basis in a non-competitive manner throughout the year. Music Lessons

NAISR offers both NAISR-run music opportunities, such as the band or orchestra and can also facilitate private music lessons with an external instructor. The individual instrumental lessons help students to develop their knowledge of a specific instrument, helping them to master skills and techniques for solo and ensemble performances. The Music department organises shows and concerts for both soloists and ensembles, allowing students to gain experience in live performance.

Other Opportunities

NAISR encourages non-NAISR individuals and groups to make use of the NAISR facility. This provides extended opportunities for families to participate in a number of other interesting activities. While these clubs and activities are hosted at NAISR, each non-NAISR club or activity is managed by an external person/organisation. After-School and Holiday Care

Funtazia offers out-of-school care for students from age four to/and including twelve. The after-school care programme provides structured activities for NAISR students on the NAISR campus.

Online Registrations

Sign-ups for all NAISR-run after school activities will be done digitally via the link found on the last page of this handbook. This link will allow you to register for all NAISR-run Clubs and Skill Development Sessions. There is a maximum number allowance of students for certain activities, so our co-curricular programme runs on a first-come, first-serve basis. The deadline for online registrations is **Monday, 6 September 2021 at 9:00**. The online form is not intended for external clubs and activities listed towards the end of this programme (Ballet, Brilliant Brushes etc.). If you are interested in any externally-run clubs and/or activities, <u>please contact the respective</u> <u>coordinator directly</u>.

Signing up After the Deadline

If you would like to register for an after school activity after the registration deadline noted above has elapsed, please contact the school directly for more information on availability.

Collection After School

Year 1-6 students in after school clubs, activities, sports and Funtazia will be sent from their classrooms at 15:05 to the pick-up point (library) where there will be supervision. Instructors from the clubs, activities and Funtazia, etc. will come to the pick-up location with an attendance sheet. If there is a discrepancy, or a club instructor does not arrive before 15:30, then the pick up point supervisor will bring the students to the front office.

Bus Services

There are no late buses available after co-curricular activities at this time. The possibility of a late bus – departing NAISR at 17:15 - would have to be considered based on the number of bus students requesting it and student addresses, and would involve an additional fee. Please be aware that Primary School bus students who sign up for an activity in Session 1 only, will need to be picked up from school by a parent at 16:00, as no supervision will be available from 16:00-17:15.

All adjustments to bus schedules are to be communicated to the Transportation Coordinator no later than 09:00.

Terms and Conditions

Students may join a SDS or club at any time during the school year if space is available and fees will be pro-rated on a month-by-month basis, not on a session-by-session basis.

All NAISR after-school activities will be held on full school days only. Activities that fall on a holiday or half day will not be scheduled. Please refer to the Academic School Calendar.

In the situation that an instructor becomes unavailable due to sickness, etc., the instructor is required to reschedule the make-up session at a mutually agreeable time.

In some cases, there may be a minimum number of participants required to open a particular SDS, club or activity. Some SDS, clubs, or activities may not run if the required number of participants is not reached. Parents will be informed if requested activities will run and confirmation emails will be sent.

The maximum number of students for an SDS group session is five.

NAISR after-school activity fees are non-refundable.

Invoices are issued by the school for NAISR-run co-curricular activities only. NAISR does not issue invoices or receipts for externally-run clubs hosted at the School. External instructors (non-NAISR employees) will issue their own invoices.

Athletics/NECIS Team Sports

NAISR is part of the Northwest European Council of International Schools (NECIS), which is an organisation of eleven schools similar to NAISR. NECIS schools are located in the Netherlands, Germany, Denmark, Sweden, Norway, Belgium, and Luxembourg. NECIS schools host and travel to other NECIS schools during the sports season, and all schools meet at the end of each season for a tournament hosted by a NECIS school. NAISR teams may also travel to or host other non-NECIS international schools or Dutch clubs during the season.

Athletic fees vary depending on the sport, length of season and tournament venue. Athletic fees cover such items as transportation, officials, accommodations, awards, facilities, tournament fees, and coaches' salaries. Please note, athletic fees cover approximately 50% of the cost to run the athletic programme; NAISR subsidises the remaining costs to encourage student participation in sports. Athletic fees are managed directly by the Athletic Department.

Primary Student Council

Primary School is one of the important first steps in a lifelong journey of learning citizenship. Using the school's VIP approach to learning as the guide, students will demonstrate respectful behaviour while considering different international perspectives as they learn vital life skills that will prepare them for later learning in their education and the world. The Primary Student Council presents a unique opportunity for young students to learn organisation, leadership and teamwork skills and prepares them for later student government positions. Being a Student Council Representative is a lot of fun and it is also a big responsibility.

The Primary STUCO is for students in Years 5 and 6. It is made up of 4 Ambassadors from Years 5 and 6 who act as the STUCO leaders, and each primary class has two STUCO student representatives from Years 5-6. The Ambassadors and Class Representative will come up with varied activity ideas, vote on the ones they want to implement, plan all aspects of the event, and then run the event. All student centered events carried out by the Student Council must be approved by the teachers and administrators of the school and will be assisted by adults.

Primary Student Council elections will be held for the STUCO Ambassadors in Years 5 and 6 at the beginning of September. After elections, the Class Representatives from Years 5 and 6 are assigned, and bi-weekly meetings will be held during a lunch break, beginning in September and will run throughout the school year.

Student Council - STUCO

The Student Council (STUCO) is an active school body that exists to represent the voice of Secondary School students in Years 7-13. STUCO members live and uphold the school Core Values, demonstrating respect and enthusiasm for developing a positive and principled school climate. STUCO members represent the opinion of others, support charitable work, and have strong organisational and planning skills.

STUCO runs for the calendar year, from January to December, with new elections held for the new STUCO in December.

Students interested in STUCO will be invited to attend an introductory informational session towards the end of Term 1 and to submit an application of interest. STUCO members will commit to attending weekly council meetings, be a part of or lead sub-committees and have full voting rights.

Meetings for secondary STUCO members will be weekly during lunch time. STUCO members can also be asked to stay after school on days that events are organised.
