




Welcome to the 2019-20 Creative Writing Competition!

Learning Outcomes

Taking part in this year's competition will help you to:

- Understand key issues around the UNCRC in relation to the theme of "Home" and the story of Stepping Stones
- Practice writing clearly, in a way that is easy to understand with correct spelling and grammar
- Use the best style of writing and language for the audience that will be reading your piece
- Get creative by making artwork out of items found in nature

- Your submission must be around the theme of "home": What is home? What does it mean to be home? What does home mean to you?

How to get started

How to get started:

- You are to develop a piece with BOTH a written and visual element. Your entry can be any mixture of writing/visual elements (for example, you can use photography, mixed media, poetry, prose, etc. to develop your idea).
- For the Visual Component: You are encouraged to produce your visual component with natural items (those found in nature). For ideas and inspiration, check out Land Artists such as Andy Goldsworthy and the illustrator of Stepping Stones, Nizar Ali Badr.
- For the Written Component: Max 500 words for all age groups.



How to enter & competition rules

How to enter:

- Submit your entry to your teacher by 13th December 2019. If you don't give it to your teacher, it can't be entered into the competition!
- Entries must be your original work
- Entries must be written in English
- Only one entry is allowed per person/group (But you are encouraged to work in pairs or groups!)
- By entering the competition, you agree that Nord Anglia Education and UNICEF can publish your entry online and in print.
