CURRICULUM AND RESULTS

YEARS 10 AND 11 (GRADES 9 AND 10)


- The (International) General Certificate of Secondary Education (IGCSE) curriculum is followed in Years 10 and 11.
- We use both Cambridge International Examinations (CIE) and EdExcel as our exam boards. Examinations are designed and marked externally by the exam boards.
- This is a two year programme with subjects taught concurrently for the two years, assessed via internal work and external examination.
- The (I)GCSE curriculum reports grades in letter format from A* (highest) to G (lowest) and, for some, 9 (highest) to 1 (lowest).

YEARS 12 AND 13 (GRADES 11 AND 12)


- The International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme (IBDP) is followed in Years 12 and 13.
- This is a two year programme with subjects taught concurrently, assessed via internal work and external examination.
- All IBDP Higher Level (HL) subjects are 240 hours over the two years and all Standard Level (SL) subjects are 150 hours over the two years.
- Core Components are graded on a 1 to 3 scale with a maximum total point score of 3 for Theory of Knowledge and the Extended Essay; no additional points are granted for Creativity Activity Service, although this requires a "Pass" to be awarded the full Diploma.
- Grades are reported on the scale from 7 (highest) to 1 (lowest).
- This is the 17th cohort to graduate, growing from 1 graduate in 2001 to 44 in 2017.




Highest points score out of 45
