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Accredited by: New England Association of Schools and Colleges (NEASC) & Council of International Schools (CIS). Collège du Léman (CDL), a Nord Anglia education school, is an independent co-educational preschool-12 school with both residential and day students. Founded in 1960, in Versoix, Switzerland about five miles from Geneva. We offer high school programmes in English and French. The Primary and Middle Schools offer programmes in English, French and bilingual tracks. Our core values are encapsulated in the acronym RISE – Respect, Internationalism, Spirit, Excellence.

HIGH SCHOOL STRUCTURE

For the first two years of high school in the Anglophone section, students choose to complete grades 9-10 or the International General Certificate of Secondary Education (IGCSE). Students then choose to pursue the High School Academic Diploma, IBDP or IBCP diploma for the remaining two years of school.

<u>DIPLOMA OFFERINGS</u>: There are five diploma tracks in the high school. Two of them are in our French Section/ 2^{nd} Cycle (listed below).

High School Academic Diploma

<u>AP courses offered:</u> Art Studio 2-D, English Language, English Literature, Calculus (AB & BC), Statistics, Computer Science Principles, Physics 1, 2, Biology, Chemistry, World History, Microeconomics*, Macroeconomics*, Psychology, Human Geography, Comparative Government and Politics, French, German, and Spanish. (*offered as a full year course).

Honors level are pre-requisites to AP science, Art and English Literature. Students are usually approved to take a maximum of 2-3 AP courses in Grade 11, and a maximum of 4 AP courses in Grade 12. Very high achieving students may take a maximum of 5 APs in Grade 12; highest number of possible APs in total are 8.

All students in HS grades 9-11 take physical education.

All students in HS grades 9-10 and IGCSE 1 and 2 take PSHE.

IB certificates are offered to High School Diploma students.

English as an Additional Language classes available in grades 9-11.

<u>Service and Extracurricular Activities:</u> High School Diploma students must gain a REACH credit each year. REACH-Responsible Citizenship, Eco-Friendly, Active, Creative and Healthy.

International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme (IBDP)

<u>IB Courses offered:</u> Biology, Business Management, Chemistry, Economics, English A Literature, English A Language and Literature, English B, Environmental Systems and Societies, French A Language and Literature, French B, French ab initio, Geography, German B, History, Italian B, Math Analysis & Approaches, Math Applications & Interpretations, Psychology, Physics, Language A Literature School Supported Self-Taught, Spanish B, Spanish ab initio, Sport Exercise and Health Science, Visual Arts.

International Baccalaureate Career-Related Programme (IBCP)

Career-related studies in Business and Sustainability with 3 strands being Fashion, Hospitality, Nature Conservation offered in partnership with SUMAS. Students take a minimum of 3 IB subjects and have the option of taking IB or High School Diploma subjects for their remaining choices.

French Baccalauréat

Students take 8 core subjects and specialise further in 3 in G11 keeping only 2 in G12 from Maths or Hist-Geo/Geopolitics; Phys-Chem or English L&L; Earth-Life Sci. or Econ. Final exams take place mostly in June with 40% based on continuous assessment.

Swiss Maturité Fédérale

Students take 12 compulsory subjects at a high level. In this bilingual diploma, three of the subjects are taught in English (History, Geography, and Economics-Law). Students complete their Maturité exams in February of their final year.

Grading scales and weighting:

AP subjects receive 1.3 weighting for GPA.

IB Career-related Program: IB classes on a 1-7 scale, non-IB on an A-F scale. GPA calculated on 4.0 scale. IB subjects at HL receive 1.3 weighting for GPA.

The French Baccalauréat follows a 0-20 scale.

The Swiss Maturité follows a 1-6 scale.

Dropped classes:

We do not report dropped classes on the final transcript if the student completed less than one semester, or if the credit was rolled into the added class (e.g. moving a level of foreign language or math level).

2019-2020 School Year Grading:

Due to online teaching from March-May 2020, no assessments were factored in the calculations of final year grades. For AP, IB2 and IGSCE2 students, mock exam grades were also included in final grade calculations. Students who entered CDL as of the final (3rd) marking period in 2019-2020 did <u>not</u> receive report card grades.

Class Rank:

The school does not calculate class rank or cumulative GPA.

GPA:

We do not calculate cumulative GPA because of the multiple grading scales and frequency of transfers of our international population.

PE and required grade 9&10 high school computer technology classes are not included in GPA calculations. **Credits:**

A credit value of 1.0 is awarded for grade of D or higher (3 on the IB scale) of a year's work in an academic subject meeting 4-6 times weekly. A half credit (.5) awarded for : a) courses meeting 2 or 3 times weekly, and b) grade of D- in a full-time class.

AP and IB HL classes receive 1.5 credits.

PE and TOK classes do not receive letter grades but receive .5 credit.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

Outside of specific diploma requirements, students in all sections receive a high school diploma if they complete at least 24 credits, including 4 English, 3 math, 3 science, 3 social science/humanities, 3 foreign language, 1 physical education. A minimum final year GPA of 1.5 (on 4.0 scale) or higher is required. All students are required to complete volunteer and extracurricular (creative and athletic) as part of graduation requirements (CAS for IBDP, Service Learning for IBCP, REACH for other diplomas).

EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES AND SPORTS

Afterschool activities and clubs include National Honor Society, charity groups, student government, Model UN, the International Award (Duke of Edinburgh), and academic, drama, arts and music groups. The athletics program includes competitive teams and intramural sports.
