


Oklahoma gets its name from the Choctaw name for 'Red People.' With more than 39 tribes located here, it is a place with deep Native American significance. Museums, cultural displays are found throughout the state that center on celebrating the different native cultures. The other side of the Old West coin, cowboys, also figure prominently in the Sooner State. Although pickups have replaced horses, there's still a great sense of the open range, interrupted only by urban Oklahoma Cities.

Day 1 • Arrive in Chickasaw Cultural Center

After your arrival in Chickisaw, your Appleseed Expeditions guide will give a formal introduction. You will then explore the Native American village. The Chikasha Inchokka' ("Chickasaw house") Traditional Village is a fascinating recreation of a historical Native American village. It features a Council House, two summer houses, two winter houses, a replica mound, a corn crib, a stickball field and a stockade fence. Later, you will enjoy dinner and have evening reflections.

Day 2 • Oklahoma City Care and Ropes Course - After breakfast you will have an introduction to City Care. The group will learn about homelessness in America. This involves meeting families and children who have struggled with being homeless and hungry. Volunteer projects include food distribution, feeding programs, light construction, mentoring and games with children, and a variety of other tasks that help CityCare. In the late afternoon we will take in a ropes challenge course in downtown OKC. Here students will use

teamwork and leadership to overcome this amazing challenge course. In the evening we will take a night hike to study the stars.

Day 3 • Volunteer at City Care and Visit the Oklahoma Cowboy Hall of Fame

This morning your group will continue volunteering at the transitional homeless center called City Care. In the afternoon the group will explore the Wild West by visiting the Cowboy Hall of Fame. America's West, with its unique blend of cultures, open terrains,

and awesome vistas, is a source of inspiration around the world. Come and experience the West with us as we explore it through its people, places, and history.

Day 4 • Fort Reno Calvary Museum -

The group will travel to the Fort Reno Calvary Museum. This was a famous fort that housed the calvary that was involved in the the famous Indian Wars. The group may be able to also take part in a calvary war reenactment. Later we will head home.
