SCHOOL AND COMMUNITY

Country Day School, founded in 1963, is a private, college-preparatory school enrolling 720 students in Preschool through Grade 12. There are approximately 210 students in the high school. Twenty two percent of the students at Country Day School are United States citizens, forty seven percent Costa Rican citizens, and thirty one percent citizens from all parts of the globe. Country Day School is accredited by the Middle States Association of Colleges and Schools and the Costa Rican Ministry of Education. Both the U.S. High School and the Costa Rican Baccalaureate programs are offered and diplomas are awarded for each. Students in the high school pursue a U.S. - based curriculum. The language of instruction is English, and the average class size is 20.

Students with a cumulative high school average of 90% are candidates for National Honor Society. Students demonstrating scholarship, leadership, character and service are candidates for membership selection.




