HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

All students graduate with a NEASC accredited US High School Diploma and must complete 4 years of high school, accruing the following academic requirements at a minimum:

4 credits in English

3 credits each in Science, Mathematics and Humanities

2 credits each in Foreign Languages and Arts/Design/PE

7 credits in Electives

24 credits total

1/3 credit is awarded for each term that the student is enrolled in a subject and achieves a minimum Grade 2 pass.

Years 10 & 11 (IGCSE)

All students in Years 10 and 11 follow the rigorous International GCSE Curriculum, which offers subjects taught over the course of two years.
