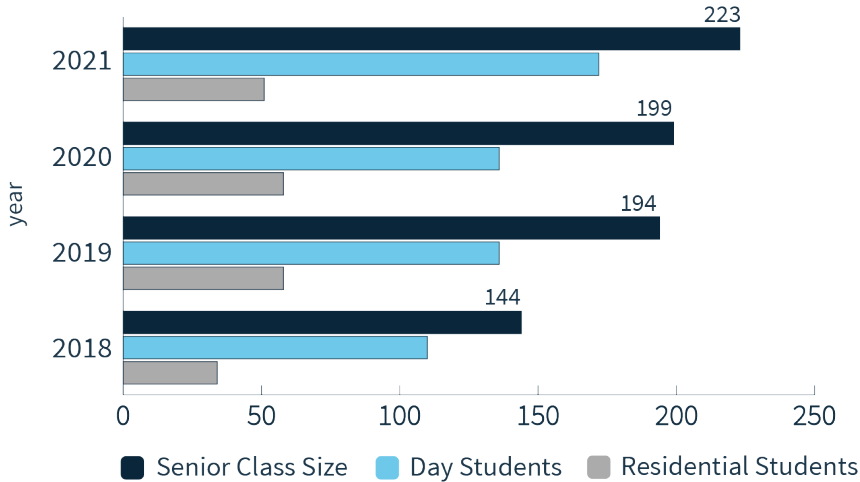




Enrollment Growth



Grading

- The Village School does not rank its students.
- Cumulative GPA averages are based only on The Village School coursework and are weighted in favor of IB courses.
- Honors Level courses are given a 4-point weighting.
- IB Standard Level and Theory of Knowledge are given a 5-point weighting.
- IB Higher Level courses are given a 10-point weighting.
- The grade point average is determined by using a 100 point scale. The lowest passing grade is 60%.
- A semester average above 100 is possible because of the work skills component which accounts for 10% of the semester grade.

Courses are graded according to the following scale:

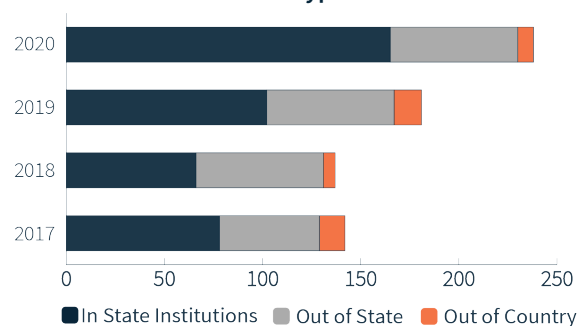

Courses not included in a Village School GPA include:

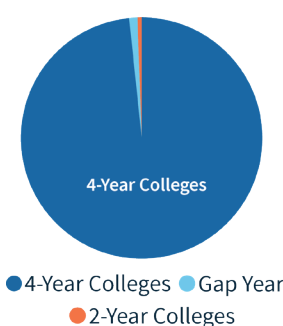
- Physical Education

- An elective course in 11th and 12th grade for which a student filed a one-time GPA waiver form. The GPA waiver form allows students to continue taking one elective course each year that will still display the grade received for the course but will not affect the student's GPA.

ENGLISH LANGUAGE LEARNERS

Students designated as English Language Learners take language proficiency tests that place them in an appropriate level with the expectation of progressing from one level to the next. While English courses, which focus on reading, writing, and oral proficiency, are leveled, ELL students may also enroll in Reading classes to reinforce language acquisition across all subject areas.

Diploma Options

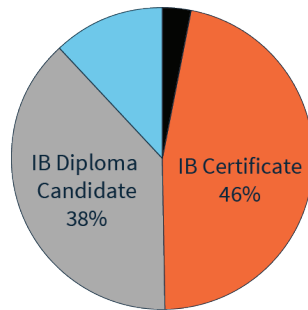
The Village School offers *three different diploma options* to guide students towards their passions and best develop their skills. All diplomas require rigorous coursework and a significant amount of academic dedication.

IB Diploma

The International Baccalaureate Program (IB) is an internationally recognized, rigorous, college-preparatory course of study. The Full IB Diploma mandates that students select courses to study throughout their 11th and 12th grades at Village. All Diploma candidates select three Higher Level course and three Standard Level courses.

The six subject areas are first language, second language, math, science, social science and an IB elective. Students must also successfully complete the Theory of Knowledge course, the 4,000-word Extended Essay and fulfill the requirements of the Creativity, Action & Service (CAS) project. Students completing the Full IB Diploma exceed the State of Texas minimum graduation requirements.

Entrepreneurship Diploma

The Entrepreneurship Diploma provides students with the critical thinking, professional, and leadership skills to navigate the business trends of an ever-changing global economy. Students are required to take a rigorous course load that includes a mixture of IB courses and business-centered electives that contribute to their learning about the entrepreneurial mindset. The courses are Entrepreneurship, Decision Making, Marketing & Strategy, Financial Literacy, Negotiations, Leadership Development, and International Business & Trade.

In addition to the core coursework, students will receive mentorship from established entrepreneurs, earn service learning hours, complete an internship that is aligned to their business idea and goals, and develop a Capstone Project that will represent a learning portfolio to present to entrepreneurs and industry professionals for analysis. Students completing the full Entrepreneurship Diploma exceed the State of Texas minimum graduation requirements.
